



# **Target Audience**

This activity is structured to meet the educational needs of anesthesiologists, critical care specialists, anesthesiologist assistants, and anesthesiology residents and fellows.

#### **Statement of Educational Need**

The theme for the 2015 NCSA/SCSA Annual Meeting is "Quality in Anesthesia". The goal of this conference is to promote quality practices across the profession; from patient care delivery to hospital management to physician lifestyle improvements. Topics that will be addressed include: clinical updates on management of chronic narcotic use and trauma patients; clinical strategies for promoting safety in the operating room; leadership strategies for cultivating a more effective workplace environment; and quality metrics for anesthesia care including their future impact on payment.

# **Learning Strategies for Participants**

- Discuss the correlation between the increase in accidental narcotic overdose deaths and opioid treatment for chronic pain.
- · Identify patients who have chronic pain/narcotic use.
- Formulate an anesthetic plan that will provide adequate analgesia for chronic narcotic-use patients postoperatively.
- Explain strategies using the narcotic medications risk evaluation and management guidelines.
- Identify the new features of state opioid databases in order to protect patients, providers and the community.
- Describe current and future trends in reporting quality metrics.
- Discuss clinical and operational strategies for promoting patient safety.
- Identify leadership strategies for departmental success.
- Define optimal business and clinical practices necessary to prepare medical residents for a successful career.
