Target Audience

This activity is structured to meet the educational needs of anesthesiologists, critical care specialists, anesthesiologist assistants and anesthesiology residents and fellows.

Statement of Educational Need

The meeting theme for the 2016 NCSA/SCSA Annual Meeting is "Quality in Anesthesia." The goal of this conference is to promote quality practices across the profession; from updates in cardiac surgery and obstetrics, to patient care delivery through improved systems-approach and better teamwork/communication in the operating room. Topics that will be addressed include: clinical strategies for promoting safety in the operating room; strategies for integrating human factors into a systems approach for delivery of care; and quality metrics for anesthesia care including their future impact on payment. The program will also include an update from ASA and the NC Medical Board, as well as a Saturday session specifically geared towards residents.

Learning Strategies for Participants

- Discuss the correlation between checklists and human factors on patient outcomes.
- Explain strategies for optimizing the use of checklists with team communication.
- Identify processes in the operating room that could be redesigned to decrease variability and increase reliability.
- Describe current and future trends in reporting quality metrics.
- Discuss clinical and operational strategies for promoting patient safety.
- Recognize optimal business and clinical practices necessary to prepare medical residents for a successful career.

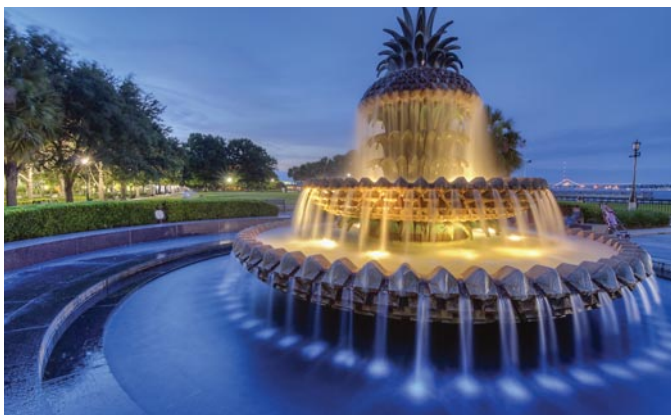
Conference Site and Hotel Reservations
