Statement of Educational Need

The theme for the 2018 NCSA/SCSA Annual Meeting is Quality in Anesthesia: Improving Outcomes and Patient Safety. The goal of this conference is to promote quality practices across the profession. Topics include the opioid crisis, anesthesia workforce, advanced recovery after surgery, OBGYN anesthesia, as well as provide a state and federal perspective on healthcare trends and anesthesia as a specialty.

The conference will include a Friday morning workshop on “Perioperative Point-of-Care Ultrasound and Focused Assessed Transthoracic Echocardiography” and a Saturday afternoon workshop on “Interactive Fascial Plane and Nerve Block for Enhanced Recovery After Surgery (ERAS)”, in addition to the resident track.

Learning Strategies for Participants

- Expand the use of transthoracic echocardiography in a point of care setting.
- Discuss current and future anesthesia workforce patterns and changes.
- Examine effective communication required for patient handoffs.
- Explain current practices in obstetric anesthesia.
- Describe how policy can affect legislation around opioid use and prescribing.
- Review clinical pathways for enhanced recovery after surgery.
- Apply the CDC guidelines for prescribing opioids to your current practice.
- Review management of chronic pain patients in the perioperative setting.
- Demonstrate how to perform facial plane block techniques for ERAS.
- Explore new technologies to address pain.
- Discuss healthcare industry trends.

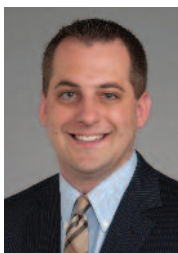

This workshop is intended for anesthesiologists of all skill levels who wish to improve their skills at performing ultrasound-guided interscalene brachial plexus nerve blocks, fascial plane blocks (transversus abdominis plane (TAP), rectus sheath, quadratus lumborum (QL), and pectoralis (PECS I & II, serratus plane block), in addition to ultrasound-guided infiltration techniques for knee surgery. The workshop focuses on 3 specific ERAS clinical pathways and the relevant fascial plane block techniques that are used with each: abdominopelvic surgery, breast reconstructive surgery, and orthopedic/orthotrauma surgery. This interactive workshop will feature small participant-to-instructor ratios and a customized curriculum focusing on developing hands-on skills. Each technique will be taught by expert instructors using dynamic multimedia presentations, live demonstrations, state of the art 3D virtual cadaver imaging and guided hands-on live model scanning.
